## Language Development "More"



Choose a motivating toy, game, or snack that provides opportunities to stimulate multiple requests for "more".



Say/sign, "more?" (as though asking a question). Pause and look expectantly at child, waiting for a response.



Accept any vocal or non-speaking response as "more", by rewarding with more, and modelling, "more".



Repeat the process with different rewards to provide further opportunities to practise.

## Activities for "More"
